

1. SOCIO-ECONOMIC SITUATION

- 1.1. CITY MANAGEMENT: A number of important anti-corruption measures have been approved
- 1.2. EMPLOYMENT: The number of people registered at the Employment service has decreased in June
- 1.3. PERSONAL INCOMES AND EXPENDITURES: Salary arears are decreasing
- 1.4. INDUSTRY: Foreign car-makers are optimistic about St. Petersburg market.
- **1.5. FINANCE**: City budget revenues are down in the 1st half of 2009.
- 1.6. MUNICIPAL SERVICES: The Concept plan of tariff policy of St. Petersburg is approved.

2. ECONOMIC REFORM

- 2.1. PRIVATIZATION: Architectural monuments transferred into the City ownership are to be privatized.
- 2.2. REAL ESTATE: Housing construction and demand for commercial real estate are falling.
- **2.3. BANKS:** Profits of ST. Petersburg banking sector are down in the 1st half of 2009.
- **2.4. INVESTMENT PROJECTS:** Total amount of foreign investments in the City's economy in the 1st half of 2009 is down by 35.1%.
